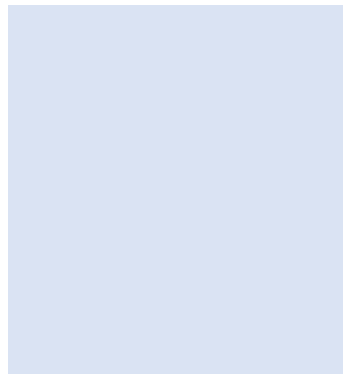

S/he will implement the project interventions to mobilize FFL couples, church and community leaders, and other community groups to ensure messages reach intended project target beneficiaries. S/he will also conduct monitoring and supervision, collect reports from FFL couples, and compile monthly reports.
