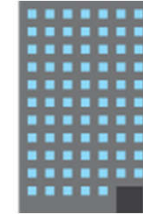
The shelter writes to ICE and takes responsibility to house a migrant awaiting asylum proceedings

The migrant finds community at the shelter and receives access to services like legal support, healthcare, and employment

4



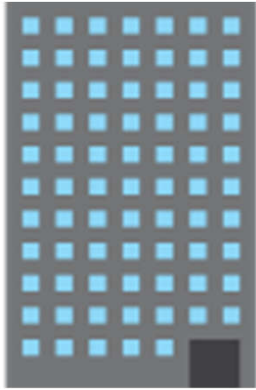
Once the migrant is living in more stable circumstances, the shelter moves them into permanent housing

5

Now that the migrant has been moved out, there is spare capacity again and the shelter can sponsor another migrant to be released from ICE detention

Bottleneck

Shelters struggle to find landlords that offer affordable, quality housing but don't require a rental history and a SSN.

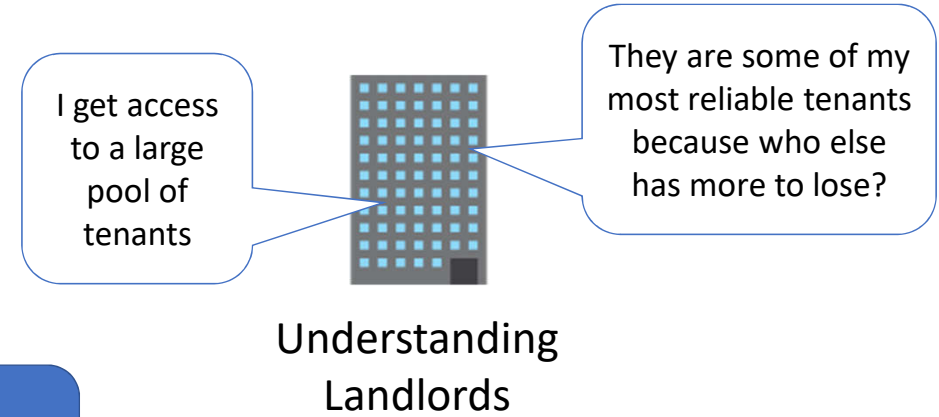
If this was easier, shelters could move migrants into their own homes earlier.

This would free up beds in the shelter and another migrant could be liberated from ICE detention.
