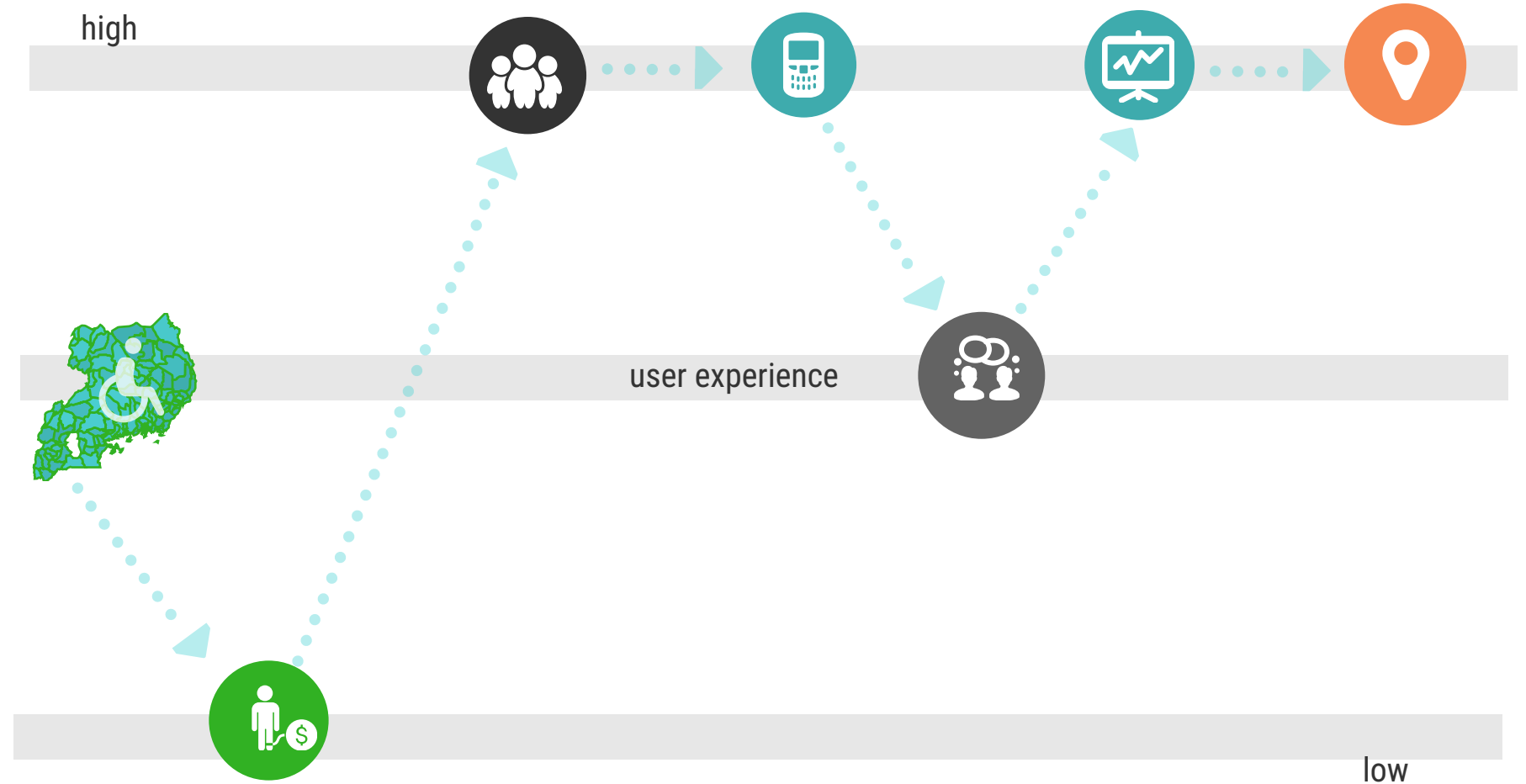


CROWD-MAPPING FOR INCLUSION:

At this point in the design phase, it would be premature to definitively outline the impact of individual experiences with Crowd-Mapping. What we can do, is use our knowledge of the population, geographical location and methodology, to identify the major components of the research and evaluate the risks and rewards. The goal of the study design is to create a user experience that is predominantly positive, however, as researchers and practitioners, we know that there will be barriers and roadblocks to overcome- beginning with the current state of individual engagement of people with disabilities (PWDs) in development. Our understanding is that this lack of inclusion contributes to negative feelings and experiences. Additionally the stigma and sensitivity around sexual and reproductive health, including HIV/AIDS, may create discomfort for some participants around sharing information. The plan is to use our previous knowledge and experiences, to design a project that considers social, physical and technical barriers- and, is flexible enough to respond to negative user experiences in a proactive and actionable manner.
