What is this?

Why are we doing this?

The Blackfeet Nation is in the process of writing an Agriculture Resource Management Plan (ARMP). To do this in a way that recognizes the many land and water uses, we have created this survey in partnership with BCC Native Science Field Center and The Nature Conservancy, to better gather your voices. Your shared understandings about these resources will inform agriculture and other long-term planning efforts such as assessing interest in a Blackfeet Land Conservation Ar

What will the ARMP do?

The ARMP document will serve as a long- range plan for the Blackfeet Nation which will provide for the utilization, protection, conservation and restoration of agricultural lands for the benefit of the Blackfeet (Amskapi Piikuni) people and future generations. This will serve to complete and implement a strategic plan for the comprehensive management of the Blackfeet Nation's agricultural resources and develop tribal policies based on the collaborative visions that the tribe and all tribal land users have for the Blackfeet Nation.

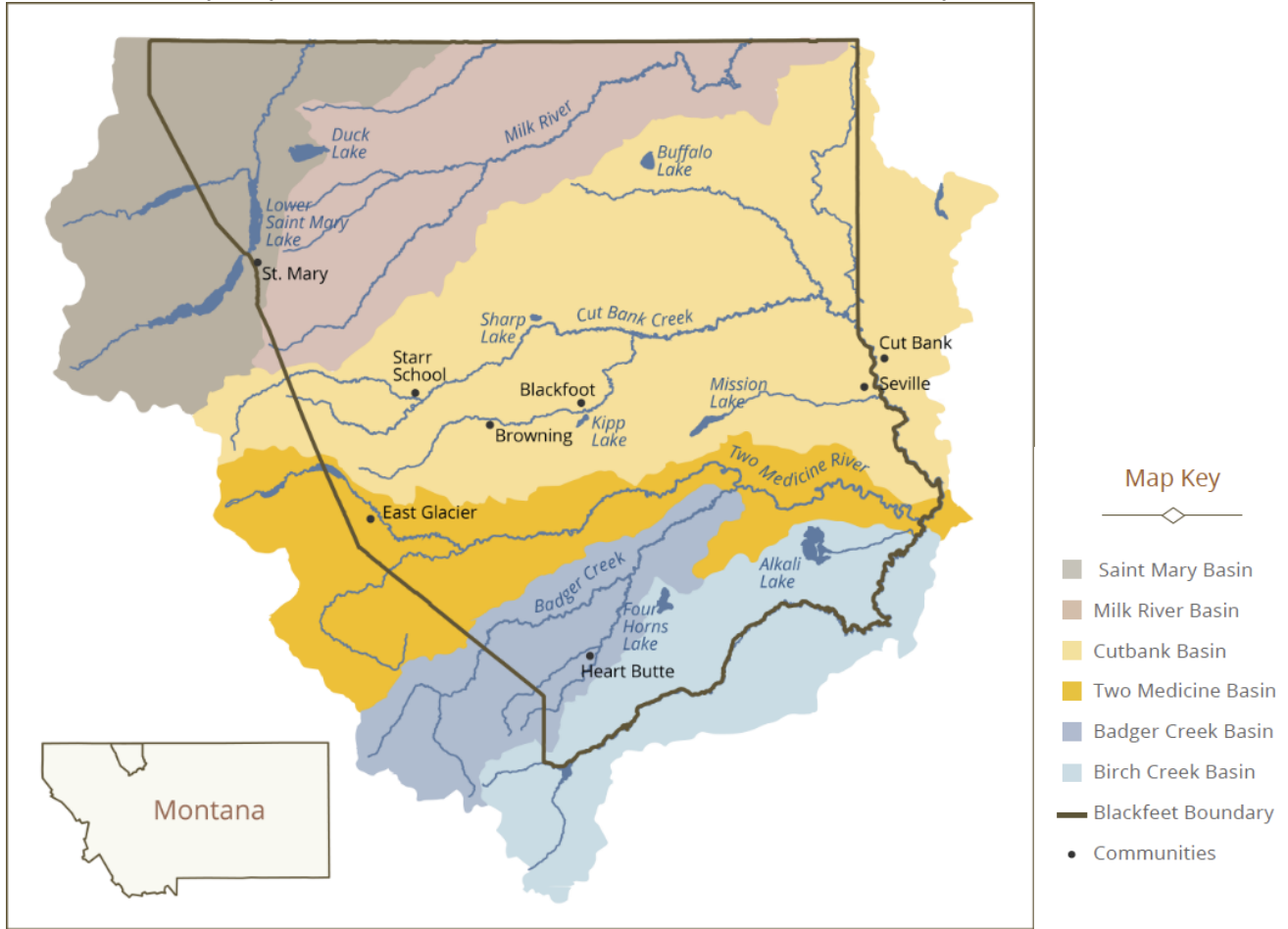
